**Study programme for which it is organized:** the Serbian language and literature**Connection to other subjects:** No.

**The subject's objectives:** To introduce students to most important literary concepts and basic tendencies in history of South Slavic literature using contemporary comparative method. By using the method for studying genetic connections and contacts of literary corpus in South Slavic area, the subject analyzes relevant concepts, procedures and tendencies in this close literary context in terms of genetic and language. The aim is to analyze relation between Serbian literature and other South Slavic literature corpus using relevant contemporary method. Due to this reason, the subject aims at studying methodological and theoretical and comparative aspects of interpreting South Slavic interlinear community.

**Outcomes:** The students will acquire basic knowledge of literary works, literary processes, similarities and differences in South Slavic area by comparing national literary corpora and explaining their specificities. The subject is based on poetic principles, that is, the students will be introduced to relevant literary and historical, literary and theoretical and comparative concepts that are necessary in contemporary studies of literature. This will contribute to better knowledge of immediate environment, that is, the closest literary and cultural context in which Serbian literature was established and developed. Furthermore, the students will acquire necessary knowledge for the work in an elementary and secondary school, where curriculum to a great extent includes authors and works belonging to the corpus of South Slavic literature.

**Methods of teaching and acquiring lessons:** Lectures, required reading, seminar paper, discussion.

**Content of the subject:** The subject's objectives can be presented by a brief summary of its content. The subject consists of a series of original lectures that contain relevant concepts and literary facts of poetic nature. The subject will provide basic notes on comparative literature, methodology used for comparative study of literature, corpora of South Slavic national literature, their genetic and contact relations, etc. The subject will use Cyril and Methodius tradition as a source of South Slavic literature, and as basic assumption for creating literary corpora in South Slavic area the subject will analyze the language, nation and country in which one nation lives and works. The scientific content of the subject will cover history of Bulgarian, Macedonia and Slovenian literature, as well as literature written in Serbian (once known as Serbo-Croatian) language. The content and plan of studying relevant literary tendencies will also cover the Illyrian movement, ideology of literary Yugoslavism, different aspects and issues regarding the notion of literature in BiH, interconnection of literary traditions, literary "nationalization" of Muslim people, etc.
