Study programme for which it is organised: French language and literature

Connection to other subjects: French language 1, French language 2, French language 3, French language 4, French language 5

Course objectives:

Theoretical and practical introduction to the syntactic laws of the French language in the form of adverbial dependent sentences to train students in communication. Increase the language (communicative) competence of students.

Practical classes: Grammar Exercises: Speech and written grammar exercises that follow a theoretical lecture aim at use of acquired knowledge from the syntax, as well as restoring the acquired knowledge of syntagms and their segments as components of the sentence.

Language exercises: The aim of these exercises is to synthesise the acquired knowledge and its application in various forms of oral and written expression, as well as a wider understanding of French culture and civilisation. *Written expression:* In these classes, the writing of essays, summaries and reviews, various types of letters, etc. are practiced, and they aim at training students for all types of written expression.

Translation: It represents continuity in translation exercises that students have been working since the beginning of the studies in order to master the translation technique to a greater extent, expand the lexical fund and learn stylistic variants in written and oral expression. *Text processing:* It involves grammatical and basic stylistic text analysis.

Outcome / results of studying (acquired knowledge):

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to identify, analyse and adopt the structure of the French complex sentence. Learning the foreseen syntax knowledge will enable students to better understand written text and oral speech at the intended level, as well as obtaining a more complete oral and written expression. Students will thus be trained in writing essays and oral interaction at the B2 level, as well as translating more complex texts from and into French.
