Study programme for which it is organised: French language and literature

Connection to other subjects: Passed subject Latin language I

Course objectives:

Mastering the basic grammatical and syntactic elements of the Latin language and translating Latin texts into the Serbian language, as well as the easy following and study of historical French grammar.

Outcome / results of studying (acquired knowledge): /

Methods of teaching and acquiring lessons: Lectures and exercises. Colloquia and exam.

Subject content: Lectures and exercises from the subject of Latin Language II include the repetition and expending of basic knowledge of the features of the Latin verbal system (the formation of verbal forms, the use of times and modes) in the form encountered in the texts of the classical period, then a detailed analysis of the functioning of Latin sentence constructs (accusative with infinitive, nominative with infinitive, ablative absolute). Translation and grammatical analysis are based on the selected Latin texts of Caesar, Cicero, Seneca, Nepot and others.
