Study programme for which it is organised: French language and literature

Connection to other subjects: Passed subjects Latin language I and latin language II

Course objectives:

The goal of teaching Latin in the third semester is that students confirm the knowledge acquired in the previous year. Reading selected texts of Latin writers further expands the lexical fund and deepens the knowledge of grammar and syntax (the syntax of the cases).

Outcome / results of studying (acquired knowledge): /

Name and surname of a professor and teaching assistant: PhD Slobodanka Prtija, professor.

Methods of teaching and acquiring lessons: Lectures and exercises. Colloquia and exam.

Subject content: Lectures and exercises in the course of the Latin Language III include the repetition and further extension of the knowledge of the Latin verbal system (the creation of gerund forms - gerund, gerundive and supine, the peculiarities of irregular verbs, defective and impersonal verbs), then the analysis and function of Latin constructions of active periphrastic conjugation and passive periphrastic conjugation. During the semester students are also closer introduced to the significance and use of case forms.
