I week	Linguistics and its subject. A place of language in human life. A language and other communication systems. Language – speech – language skills. A language and a thought. A language and reality.
II week	General linguistics and linguistics of individual languages. Types of language classification. Language distribution (language picture of the world). Language universals.
III week	Development of language study. Prestructural, structural, transformational-generative and poststructural period.
IV week	Language system and language structure. Language sign. Signified and signifier. Syntagmatic and paradigmatic relations. Synchronic and diachronic concepts. Hierarchy of language levels. General linguistics and grammatical terms.
V week	Phonetics and phonology. Sound, phoneme, allophone, and facultative phoneme variant. Distinctive features. Phonological oppositions. Prosody. Graphology. Reading and writing.
VI week	Morphology, morphematic, morphonology. Types of morphemes. Morpheme and morphology. Morphological, word-formation and morphemic analysis.
VII week	Syntax. Syntax units: syntaxeme, clause, sentence and connected text. Syntagmatic and paradigmatic relations in syntax. Types of syntax: traditional, structural, functional, transformational-generative syntax.
VIII week	Lexicology. Words and lexemes. Structure of a dictionary.
IX week	Semantics. Types of semantics units. Semant, component. Semant. Relations on different levels of language structure. The semantic triangle. Types of meaning and their conditionality.
X week	Pragmatics. Speech acts. Structure of conversation and text.
XI week	Stratification of language. Language, dialect, sociolect. Language norm and standardization. Literary language. Functional differentiation and language culture.
XII week	Study of language until 19 century. Study of language in ancient Greece. Indian school of grammar study.
XIII week	Study of language in 19 century. First scholars in comparative linguistics. Humboldtism in linguistics. Neogrammarian.

XIV week      Study of language in 20 century. Progressive Slavic schools. Ferdinand de Saussure. Geneva school of linguistics. Phonological era in linguistics. Prague school of linguistics. Copenhagen school of linguistics.

XV week      Generative approach to language. Noam Chomsky.
