Course objectives:

Morphological topics are addressed, and the aim is for students to adopt basic grammatical concepts such as word, morpheme, morph, allomorph, word types, morphological analysis, word formation, and so on. All types of words will be processed - their formation and morphological features in the Serbian literary language, and students will analyse and compare methods of their morphological description in different grammars of the Serbian language. The curriculum focuses on the practical use of knowledge that will be improved by text analysis and possibly writing seminar papers.

Outcome / results of studying (acquired knowledge): After listening to these lectures, students will be able to easier master the knowledge related to the morphological-creative and lexical characteristics of the contemporary Serbian language: they will be able to define, describe and explain basic grammatical concepts, describe the morphological features of the Serbian literary language, explain and apply the principles of morphological and creative analysis of words in Serbian language, enumerate and describe the morphological and creative characteristics of all kinds of words in Serbian; explain the characteristics of grammatical (primarily morphological) categories in the Serbian literary language, interpret, interpret and analyse texts at the morphological and creative level, recognise and explain the formation modes and the ways in Serbian language etc.
