Course objectives

The aim of the course is to introduce students to American poetry made since the 1970s, contemporary theoretical texts authored by the poets studied, and the most recent approaches to the study of poetry in general.

Learning outcomes

Students learn about the general characteristics of American poetry since the 1970s. Selected poets are studied in greater detail, with special attention paid to their theoretical texts. In addition, students demonstrate to what extent they have acquired theory and are able to apply it in practice by writing term papers and giving oral presentations.

Course topics

In the introductory part, the course gives an insight into the social, historical and cultural context as reflected in contemporary American poetry. An overview of the poetic legacy preceding the period under consideration locates the novelties brought by contemporary American poetry, and also the way in which it correlates with major social and political events and contemporary culture.

A brief overview of the most recent theories of poetic art serves as an introduction to the study of the poetry and poetics of selected poets. The acquired knowledge of literary theory is applied to the reading of Adrienne Rich, Robert Bly, Charles Wright, Charles Simic, Michael S. Harper, Louise Glück, Joy Harjo, Rita Dove, etc.
